Rail

Florida East Coast Railway (Class II) goes north to Jacksonville and south to Miami through Indian River County. It runs parallel to U.S. Highway 1 and serves PortMiami, Port Everglades, and the Port of Palm Beach.

Roadways



Indian River County is within 3 hours of 90% of Florida's population - 18 million people.

- I-95 is the primary north-south transportation route through Indian River County, less than 10 miles from the county's population centers, with convenient access from virtually anywhere in the county.
- U.S. Highway 1 is the historic business route that runs directly through the county's urban centers.
- State Road 60 is the main east-west artery between Vero Beach and the Tampa Bay area on Florida's west coast, with Florida's Turnpike just 30 minutes away.
- County Road 512 provides easy access to industrial and residential sites in Fellsmere and Sebastian, including the Sebastian Municipal Airport.

Airports



The Indian River County region provides a number of airport options, covering businesses' needs from corporate travel to air cargo shipping.

- The international airports at Melbourne and Orlando provide area companies with a full menu of air and air cargo shipping options.
- Vero Beach Regional Airport has 3 runways that range from 3,500+ feet to 7,300+ feet.
- There are also a number of other local airports, including Sebastian Municipal Airport, that serve primarily small personal and corporate aircraft.
